Marian Center Board President Dan McCarville was invited to be a member of the Marian Center board of directors in 2005 and was named Vice President in 2007. With the unfortunate passing of founder and President, Denis Virnig in 2009, Dan became President.

Even before becoming a board member, Dan was a devoted substitute adorer, often subbing during the middle of the night hours. Because of the nature of his career and his involvement with his three children's busy lives, it was difficult to commit to the same hour every week. "Some people may think it is strange that, in the 18 years of Perpetual Eucharistic adoration, the President has never had a regular hour," Dan said. "However, since taking over the adoration substitute schedule, I have come to realize the importance of substitute adorers. We can not function without them! I encourage the Catholic people of our Deanery to become substitute adorers. They can accept hours completely on their own terms. The Mother of America Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel is the easiest place to pray that I have ever been."

When reflecting on the Marian Center's successful history, Dan said, "I am often asked how the Marian Center survived for this many years. It equates to over 150,000 hours of adoration! There are so many answers for this:

Did You Know?

A digital copy of the Vilnius Divine Mercy image with the inscription "Jesus, I trust in You," hangs in the Mother of America Chapel at the Marian Center for Peace. In 1931, Jesus appeared to a Polish nun, Sister Faustina Kowalska, and told her to have an image painted according to the pattern she observed so it could be venerated throughout the world, providing a wellspring of mercy and hope. Jesus told St. Faustina, "I am Love and Mercy Itself. I never reject a



contrite heart. The graces of My Mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is TRUST. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive."

The Marian Center encourages devotion to the Divine Mercy by providing Divine Mercy chaplet and novena prayer sheets to parishes and by coordinating Divine Mercy Sunday devotions the first Sunday after Easter. The Chapel is designated as a Divine Mercy Chapel through the apostolic blessing of Saint Pope John Paull II. Therefore, we request adorers to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet for those who will die during that hour.
